## Our Commitment to our Community: Faith into Action

Here are 2 ways to make a difference in the lives of our our neighborhood children this summer.



For the past several years, St. Andrew's has been a major supporter of our Community Summer Lunch Program (SLP) which provides lunch plus so much more for students in our area (most of whom would be receiving free or reduced lunches during the school year). We take seriously our commitment to live out our faith in real action. Feeding the hungry year-round has been a long-term focus of our parish, as evidenced through our Community Meal Program and Christmas Day Dinner.

The SLP welcomes any child living in the Shippensburg Area School District boundaries ages 5-17 and serves an average of 40 students. The program is a friendly environment filled with different daily activities that appeal to many interests: reading, art, music, and sports.

Our vestry has committed support for this program as they know the positive impact this program has on our community children. In past years, we have offered \$1000 each year, often raised through a silent auction, to this program to help support their staffing needs and to provide funds for age-appropriate programming for teens. This year we're making an ask for direct donations. Please help us make an impact in our community by making a generous donation to this worthwhile program.

#### Approaching the Gospels Bible Study This Sunday at 10:30 a.m.



On the first Sunday of every month we gather for Bible Study in our parish library. This is an opportunity to explore, learn more about, and share our insights on passages from our gospel, the "good news of Jesus".

Our conversations are lively, helpful, and structured in a way to listen to everyone's ideas and yet stay focused on what we can learn from the texts. This Sunday we will be exploring in more depth the gospel we will hear in church, the passage sharing with us two of Jesus' healing miracles. The gift the gospels offer us is that even when the stories are so familiar to us (like the woman reaching out for the fringe on Jesus' cloak), we can hear them almost from a brand new place when we really sit with them and allow them to speak to us and to hear other people's thoughts.
