Grant, we beseech thee, that all who partake of this Holy Communion may worthily receive the most precious Body and Blood of thy Son Jesus Christ, and be filled with thy grace and heavenly benediction; and also that we and all thy whole Church may be made one body with him, that he may dwell in us, and we in him; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord; By whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Ghost all honor and glory be unto thee, O Father Almighty, world without end. **AMEN.**

We are delighted to welcome **The Rev. Canon Robert Schiesler** today as your preacher and celebrant. He has served our diocese faithfully for many years and is now a retired priest, enjoying his time visiting with and sharing the sacraments with people like you. After you receive the bread from the priest, you will pick up an individual cup of wine. Please feel free to linger by the altar as you

eat the bread and drink the wine, savoring this holy moment of communion. You may then place your cup on the tray in the sacristy as you exit the sanctuary to return to your seat.
